# Featured Activities of the W. Montague Cobb/NMA Health Institute 2023

### **Overview:**

Beginning in February 2023and continuing throughout August 2023, the W. Montague Cobb/NMA Health Institute recruited physicians identified in key cities across the United States to address common questions, concerns, and hesitancies that community members have regarding COVID-19 and COVID-19 Vaccines. Selected cities are those which have been identified as having the highest rates of vaccine hesitancy and lowest rates of vaccine uptake among Black residents. To combat this, the Cobb Institute recruited physicians who are active leaders within the identified cities, and thus, are well-known and, more importantly, well-trusted within their communities. These trusted experts were featured in virtual interviews, Live Streaming and Health Fairs and Vaccination Events that were hosted in selected cities.



## New York, New York March 09, 2023

### **Event Summary:**

On March 9, 2023, the W. Montague Cobb/NMA Health Institute, AOU Research Program in partnership with The Juneteenth Freedom Fest, NYC presented Ginger Ale & Vicks Vapor Rub Speaker Series addressing the lack of trust surrounding Healthcare, COVID-19 and personalized medicine to the community of Harlem Central. This event was FREE and was held at State Office Plaza 163 W. 125<sup>th</sup> Street in Harlem for a Town Hall speaker series which provided community members from Harlem Central a chance to speak directly to healthcare professionals and leaders in medical research. Participants had a chance to engage and say what was on their minds as the panelist addressed the medical distrust in the Harlem Community. The audience was predominately Gen-Zers and Millennials. The event was moderated by Shequanda Long/Founder of JFFNYC, Inc and the panelist included Dr. Glen McWilliams/General Urology, Justine Bapistia/Dula & Advocate, Dawn Aldrich/Research Patient Advocate, Pastor Mimsie Robinson/Community Liaison.

In addition to the Trusted Experts Panel, information on COVID-19 vaccinations, free health screenings locations and resources were provided free of charge to community members. Several local partners, including community-based organizations and media teams, also participated in the event.
